### POLARISATION AND EXCLUSION

The lives of children in refugee camps like the ones on Lesbos is often characterised by conflict between different refugee communities, **marginalisation from public and civic life** and polarisation between refugee and local communities.



### PEER-TO-PEER EDUCATION

Peacebuilders provides refugee children and young people with training in **intercultural, digital, technological and creative skills** necessary to integrate into 21st century European society. Following a peer-to-peer approach, the participants then help to deliver the programme to the wider community.

### COMMUNITY BENEFIT

As a result, the participants can positively contribute to their community. They increase awareness towards acceptance and **intercultural dialogue** or convert waste in the camps into useful everyday items. These roles increase their **self-confidence** and ownership of the programme.
